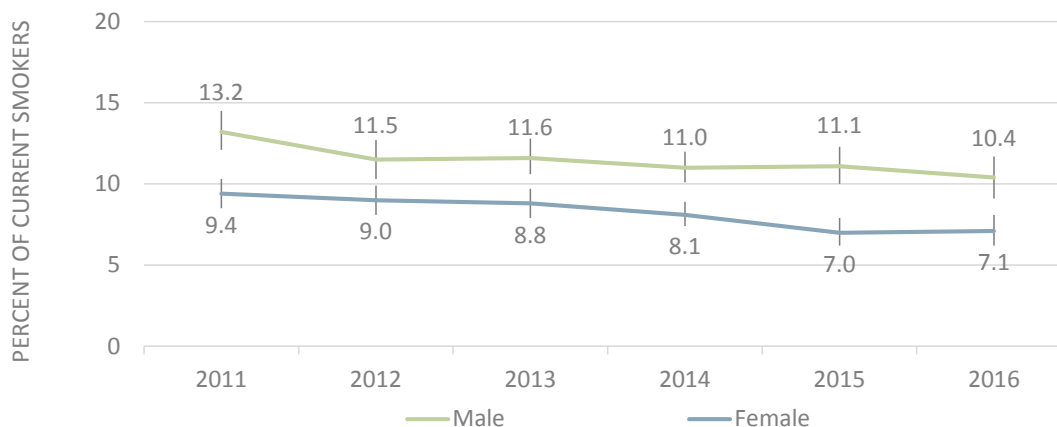


UTAH ADULT SMOKING BY SEX AND SEXUAL ORIENTATION

Adult Smoking by Sex

For the past 6 years, adult males have consistently reported higher cigarette smoking rates than females. The smoking rate for Utah males declined from 13.2% in 2011 to 10.4% in 2016; females reported a decline from 9.4% in 2011 to 7.1% in 2016.¹

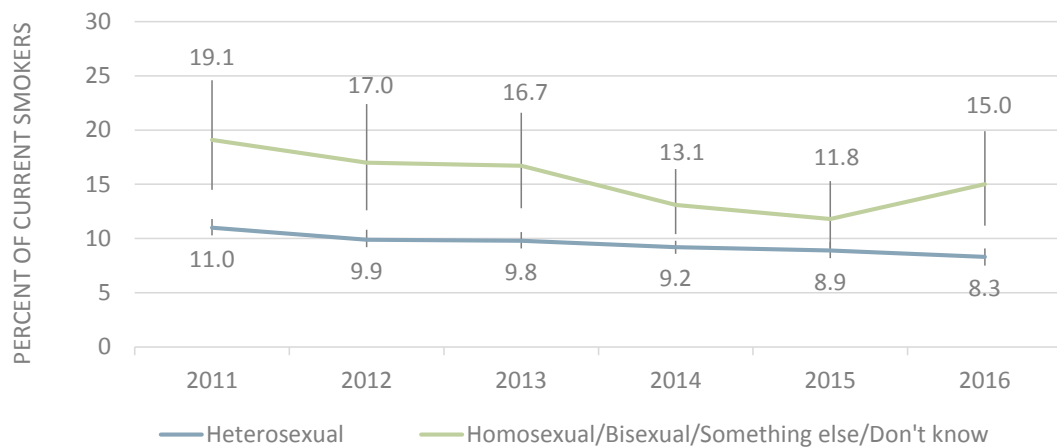
Percent of Adults Who Reported Current Smoking by Sex, Utah, 2011-2016 (age-adjusted)¹



Adult Smoking by Sexual Orientation

From 2011 to 2015, the cigarette smoking rate for Utahns who listed their sexual orientation as homosexual, bisexual, something else, or not sure declined from 19.1% to 11.8%. In 2016, the reported rate was 15%. The smoking rate for Utahns who listed heterosexual as their sexual orientation declined from 11.0% to 8.3%.¹
